

GUIDELINES FOR EVALUATING MVR

1. EVALUATING MVR

After securing the MVR, review each one, considering violations and accidents which have occurred in the last three years.

2. DEFINITION OF QUESTIONABLE MVR

<u>Questionable Criteria</u>	<u>Number of Occurrences</u>
a. Major violation - hit and run; DWI; driving without license; reckless driving; evading responsibility; driving under suspension or revocation; possessing or using narcotics	(1) One
b. Major speeding violation (over 20 MPH)	(1) One
c. Minor speeding violation; any standard moving violation; and any "at fault" accident	(2) Two
d. Not "at fault" accidents	(3) Three
e. Equipment violations	(1) One, if contributing to accident (3) Three, if not

For purpose of this evaluation, speeding violations are assumed to be major violations unless otherwise specified, and all accidents are considered "at fault" unless facts indicate otherwise.
