RUA: Are You a Defensive Driver?

RUA stands for Recognize the Hazard, Understand the Defense, and Act Correctly in Time. This is the core tenant in the National Safety Council's Defensive Driving Program.

LGRMS has provided defensive driving training through the National Safety Council's Defensive Driving Course for over two decades. In that time, we have provided this training to thousands of local government employees. It is a very effective course.

Defensive Driving Tip: Deadly Choice, Speeding

From the NSC 10th Edition DDC manual

Speeding continues to be at the top for driving behaviors that contribute to collisions leading to deaths, injuries, and property damage.

- Speeding is a factor in more than one-quarter of all traffic fatalities.
- Excessive speed reduces the amount of time and space the driver has to react in a dangerous situation to avoid a crash.



- Speeding increases vehicle stopping distance.
- Speeding reduces the ability of road safety structures such as guardrails, crash cushions, median dividers, and barriers to protect vehicle occupants in a crash.

Driving too slowly can also be a factor in collisions. Driving below the posted minimum speed or traveling too slowly in the passing lane causes ripples in the traffic flow. Frustrated drivers often use risky moves to overtake or get around slow vehicles. *If you must drive slowly, use less-traveled roads and avoid rush hour traffic.*

Responsible Choices

Determine the safest speed by knowing the speed limit and adjusting your speed based on the conditions.

Use time management while driving. Know where you're going and how much time it takes to get there.

Monitor your speed regularly. Slow down in work zones and school zones.

If someone is tailgating you, slow down a bit and let the vehicle pass.
